COASTAL LOWLANDS FROM DEER ARM TO NORTHERN PARK BOUNDARY CLOSED TO SNOWMOBILING IN GROS MORNE NATIONAL PARK

ROCKY HARBOUR, NL, April 1, 2019 – Due to deteriorating snow conditions on the coastal lowlands snowmobiling will not be permitted in the area from Deer Arm to the northern park boundary, up to 250 m elevation. Please see attached map.

This closure is in force from April 1, 2019 until May 15, 2019.

While the permit required to access the national park by snowmobile identifies the season as November 1, 2018 to May 15, 2019 (for Resident Permit Holders) and January 15 to April 30, 2019 (for Public/Commercial Snowmobile Permit Holders), dates are subject to change at the discretion of Parks Canada due to factors such as, but not limited to, unfavorable snow conditions, dangerous areas, or impact to ecosystems.

Parks Canada thanks snowmobilers for their cooperation and understanding, for respecting the designated corridors, and working with our staff to protect and preserve our environment during the 2018-19 season. By following the conditions of the snowmobile permits, riders have helped to ensure the important ecosystems of Gros Morne National Park are protected into the future.
