OLD BRIDGE AT DEER ARM BROOK TO BE REMOVED THIS WEEK

Gros Morne National Park

Rocky Harbour, NL, February 13, 2018 – Parks Canada wishes to advise the public that with the new bridge in place, work to remove the old Deer Arm Brook Bridge will begin on February 13, 2018. The work will take approximately two weeks to complete. The new bridge is now open and will remain open to traffic while the old bridge is removed.

The safety of the public and workers is Parks Canada's top priority. Motorists are asked to travel with caution, respect all on-site signage and posted speed limits, and to follow instructions from on-site personnel.

This project is part of Parks Canada's unprecedented \$3 billion dollar investment over five years to support infrastructure work to heritage, visitor, waterway and highway assets located within in national historic sites, national parks, and national marine conservation areas across the country. These investments represent the largest federal infrastructure plan in the history of Parks Canada.
