

MINGAN THISTLE

ACTIVITÉ	DESCRIPTION
GARDEN VIRGINIA (CLOSE TO THE MARINA, HAVRE-SAINT-PIERRE)	Here is your chance to observe beautiful plants such as the Mingan thistle, the Gulf of St. Lawrence dandelion and the sparrow's egg lady's slipper, even if you don't end up going to the islands. Learn more about Brother Marie-Victorin who stayed in the Minganie between 1924 and 1928, and discover the ties that connected him to the locals.
SOS THISTLE GAME (PORTAIL PÉLAGIE-CORMIER, HAVRE-SAINT-PIERRE)	All are welcome to play the game SOS Thistle. As you play, learn more about the Mingan thistle, this rare plant which is at risk of extinction. Playing this game is easy! It features the Mingan thistle and is played in the same way as Snakes and Ladders. Each square on the board is linked to interesting information provided in a booklet. Check it out to learn more about this magnificent plant!
WHERE TO SEE THE MINGAN THISTLE	During the last few years, Parks Canada's biologists have been busy at work with the intention to preserve the Mingan thistle. It is possible for you to observe some plants in their natural environment on Île Niapiskau or Île du Fantôme. The Grenier Boréal, in Longue-Pointe-de-Mingan, has a "chardonner", a garden where thistle seeds were planted by students from the village's school.

For the full island experience, why not spend the night on one of the islands of the archipelago? There are options to suit every taste: wilderness camping, oTENTik tents, Ôasis accommodations or a 4-star accommodation.

- › Opening season: Mid-June to Mid-September. Baie de Quarry Ouest campground is accessible until September 30th. It is possible to camp before and after these dates. Contact our Reception and Interpretation Centres.
- › Camping permit IS mandatory.
- › Please note that you may have some distance to walk from the wharf to get to the campgrounds. Contact our Reception and Interpretation Centres for more information.
- › There are outhouses and a wood shelter near the campsites. Firewood is supplied.
- › There are no restaurants on the islands and drinking water is not provided.

CAMPGROUND

Enjoy a peaceful stay and experience a journey of discovery. Campsites are equipped with a tent platform, a picnic table and a cooking fireplace and are available on six different islands.

OTENTIK TENT

Enjoy a furnished, heated and lit accommodation, a cross between a tent and a rustic cabin. Built on a raised floor and attached to a small patio, the oTENTik tent is also equipped with a barbecue with a side burner (propane included). Each unit can accommodate up to six people.

GROUP CAMPING

On Île du Havre, in Anse des Noyés, there are two campsites especially designed for organized or school groups. Each site can accommodate 12 to 25 people and is equipped with picnic tables, a cooking fireplace and three tent platforms.

ÔASIS

Make it a memorable family experience or couple's getaway in a teardrop-shaped 'duplex'. Each unit is equipped with a convertible table/bed on the main level that can accommodate two adults (maximum) as well as a suspended hammock loft above, perfect for two children or one adult (maximum 180 kg). A barbecue with a side burner is available on site (propane included).





BEFORE YOU LEAVE

- › Book your trip with a boat operator recognized by Parks Canada to plan your access to the islands (additional fees apply).
- › Visit one of our Reception and Interpretation Centres at least one hour prior to your departure to get your camping permit (mandatory).
- › Arrive at the dock or beach at least 30 minutes prior to your departure time.
- › Make sure you know when and where the boat will pick you up on the day of your return to the mainland.

- › **Reservation, change or cancellation fees**
Online: \$11.50 | By phone: \$13.50 This fee is non-refundable.
Reservation fee is charged per stay (a series of consecutive nights) for each site.
- › If campers **do not return at the expected time**, voluntarily or otherwise, applicable fees for site rental and daily admission will be charged upon their arrival, based on the length of their extended stay.
Authorization required. Other fees may apply.
- › In case of cancellation, fees will be charged.

FOR AN OPTIMAL EXPERIENCE, DON'T FORGET TO BRING:

- › Food and drinking water for at least two extra days (we recommend 2 litres per day per person).
- › Your kitchenware, cutlery and dishes.
- › A good sleeping bag, warm waterproof clothes and hiking boots.
- › A small axe and some matches.
- › An adequate communication device and a first aid kit.

HIKING

In total, 80 km of trails spread over nine different islands will allow you to discover the life by the sea, the heart of the islands, the forest, the barrens and the peat bogs. Step by step, on the trails or along the beaches, soak in the moments and discover intriguing natural sculptures while admiring this exceptional setting!

FOR YOUR SAFETY

Hiking along the shoreline is a great way to explore the Mingan Archipelago, but please, be aware of the following risks:



Falling rocks are a hazard near the cliffs. When possible, keep a safe distance, avoid walking beneath overhanging rocks and do not stop at the base of cliffs. Hike around low tide to stay away from the cliffs. Even with these precautions, be aware that falling rocks may sometimes be unavoidable and dangerous.



Please proceed with caution. Some areas along the shoreline may present difficult walking conditions and may cause you to fall. At low tide, water and seaweed on the rocks create slippery conditions. Hiking along the shoreline can be difficult at high tide as water may block the trail.



Climbing on the monoliths is dangerous and prohibited.



Nautical activities and transportation



The Mingan Archipelago National Park Reserve is only accessible by boat.

The boat operators mentioned in this brochure provide a variety of transportation services to the islands. Through an agreement with Parks Canada, these operators must respect the itineraries and schedules as well as ensure a high standard of service.

It is strongly recommended that you contact these service providers for more information or to make reservations. A minimum number of passengers is required for the trips to take place.

Note: It is prohibited to access the park with boat operators who do not hold a business license issued by Parks Canada.

NOTICE

Some contractors offer activities outside of the park. These activities, including navigation around the park, are the sole responsibility of the contractors concerned.

Parks Canada is not responsible for accidents or incidents that may occur during activities outside the park boundaries.

Contact the boat operator to learn more about maritime conditions before your departure (recommended).

BE INFORMED!

Before setting out to enjoy sea activities in the archipelago, make sure you have all the equipment and information you need. This will contribute to your safety and enhance your experience.

- › Make sure you have an adequate communication device. Mobile phone coverage is limited in the park.
- › Visit the slgo.ca website to view the “Mingan Atlas of Currents” (ocean currents around the Mingan islands).
- › Ask about the mandatory equipment that you need to bring for your sea expedition.
- › Get the tide tables and topographic maps from our Reception and Interpretation Centres.
- › Visit charts.gc.ca to get nautical charts.
- › Make sure you know the other specificities related to navigating in the archipelago.

A CONSERVATION TEAM DEDICATED TO THE PROTECTION OF NATURAL AND CULTURAL RESOURCES

THE DECLINE OF BATS

Populations of several bat species have been declining in Canada since the emergence of white-nose syndrome, a disease which affects bats during the winter season. This disease has progressed slowly to the Mingan Archipelago where it was first observed in the summer of 2018.

The conservation team has been using bioacoustic recording stations to monitor bat species found on the Mingan Islands every summer since 2015. In the summer of 2022, for the eighth consecutive year, nine recording stations will be deployed on five islands. Echolocation calls are recorded with ultrasound devices and converted into sonogram data, which makes it possible to identify the species to which calls belong. Since 2015, five different bat species have been identified, including two species that are endangered in Canada, the Little Brown Myotis and the Northern Myotis.



MONITORING SEABIRD COLONIES

The Mingan Archipelago is well known for its population of seabirds. The Atlantic Puffin is certainly the most popular one, but we can find other species along the coastal cliffs. Indeed, a large number of Common Murres, Razorbills and Black-legged Kittiwakes are nesting in these coastal ecosystems. They are present in two sectors, that is at Île à Calculot des Betchouanes and at Île aux Perroquets and its surroundings.

Having healthy seabird populations is an important element of coastal ecosystems and they are monitored periodically by the conservation team at the Mingan Archipelago National Park Reserve. The number of breeding pairs of each species are counted every five years. This survey will determine the trend of these seabird populations in order to evaluate the health of the ecosystems in the park.



MONITORING RARE PLANT

Many rare plant species can be found in the Mingan Archipelago, thanks to its geological, climatic and geographical characteristics. Some of these distinctive plants are monitored by the conservation team every five years.

In 2022, four species will be monitored: woolly alpine chickweed, hybrid twisted-stalk, and two ferns: mountain bladder fern and smooth woodsia. In total, 15 colonies spread over five different islands will be visited by the park's biologists. Each colony is visited to document its persistence and health status, as well as to estimate the number of plants. Historically, populations of these four species have been generally stable or increasing, which is a good indicator of the ecological integrity of the barrens ecosystem in the archipelago.

- › Use only established trails or keep to areas with no vegetation when walking along the coastline.
- › Respect the Code of Ethics for Seabird Observation and Navigation in the Mingan Archipelago.
- › Make sure to read and obey park regulations.
- › Bring your garbage back with you after your stay in the park.
- › Avoid feeding the animals.
- › Leave your drone at home.

That's why we delete visitor images taken by our cameras.
